- The park has 45 campsites with electricity. Some sites have water and sewer available. For those who plan to camp in tents, restrooms with shower facilities will be available on-site. Campsites are available on a first-come, first-served basis – the city does not accept reservations. PLEASE NOTE: The city park does not allow campfires.
 - Campers are welcome to arrive and depart at their convenience, with the added option of attending the Thursday evening service at the church in Martinstown for those who arrive early in the week. Martinstown meets at 7:00 p.m.

Things to do in and around Unionville, Missouri

The set of numbers following each activity are the GPS coordinates of the parking lot for that activity. Just put those coordinates into the GPS of your phone and it will take you there. If you have questions about any of these, please ask Chad Gatlin or one of the other locals.

- The Unionville City Park (where we camp) has a frisbee golf course, a basketball court, some play equipment, and a walking trail.
- Walking trail around the school. The Prairie Trail is a six-tenths of a mile rock and cement trail that winds through the softball complex and practice football field on the south side of school property. Trail walkers enjoy the scenery as well as the incline of a couple of small hills. Both the track and trail are lit from 5 a.m. to dawn and again from dusk to 9 p.m. The facilities are open as much as possible for patrons to use and enjoy. (40.46626182006178, -93.00655459900976).

- **Morris Prairie Conservation Area.** Morris Prairie is noted as one of the last remaining tall-grass prairies in Missouri.

- Putnam County Historical Museum (at the southeast corner of Unionville square) will be open at 1:30pm (40.47603973363172, -93.00188759622338)
- Lake Thunderhead – relaxing walk across dam or fishing from bank at campground (40.534344017690344, -93.02495839221437)
